The school has adopted the following general rules to foster a secure and productive environment. The following rules reflect the school's policy on student appearance and behaviour.

General Standards Statement

The attention of students, parents and guardians is called to the following 'General Standards Statement' adopted by the Board of Governors to which students must adhere and the Principal will insist upon. This should be read in conjunction with School Rules.

"Politeness, courtesy of speech and conduct as well as cleanliness of person and dress will be insisted upon. Students should realize that they are responsible to the school authorities not only for their conduct in the school but also for their general behaviour outside. Any reported or observed objectionable conduct out of school on the part of students would make them liable to disciplinary action. A pupil who fails consistently in the same standard may be asked to leave the school. Any student who is persistently insubordinate or is willfully mischievous or is guilty of malpractice in connection with examinations or has committed a serious act of indiscipline and/or misbehaviour or, who in the opinion of the Principal, has an unwholesome influence on his/her fellow students will be asked to leave the School."

School rules apply during term time and while students are travelling to and from school. The Boarding Handbook provides a separate list of Boarding House Rules.

All students are expected to read and learn the School Rules.

Discipline

The most important rule is that every student should be thoughtful and considerate of others and use his/her common sense. In general, students must observe all School Rules as they apply to the safety and well- being of fellow students.

Every student should take full advantage of the educational opportunities available at the school. An important part of student's education is learning to make correct decisions and to accept responsibility for his/her behavior. To protect student's rights and the rights of others, student behavior guidelines have been established.

If a student comes to school with a positive attitude to learn and to take part in school activities, s/he will not have problems with these school rules governing student behavior.

SCHOOL RULES

Students, parents and school share the responsibility for creating the best possible school setting. The school provides a quality staff and program to help student succeed in a complex world. Parents must be supportive of the student, and guide him/her in making good judgments. A student must respect himself, his classmates, the school staff and all school property. The school believes in self-discipline. However, the school operates on a zero tolerance policy for the following:

- 1. Possession, consumption, supply or use of illicit drugs tobacco, alcohol, narcotic substances, tranquilizers, etc.
- 2. Possession of antisocial, dangerous and disruptive articles such as knives, catapults, guns, fire arms, crackers, any other sharp objects, etc.
- 3. Antisocial behaviour & acts such as theft and forgery.
- 4. Bullying and harassment of any kind.
- 5. Sexual Harassment and overt display of affection between students & staff
- 6. Malpractice in the examination process
- 7. If any student is persistently insubordinate or is willfully mischievous or is guilty of malpractice in connection with examinations or has committed a serious act of indiscipline and/misbehavior or who in the opinion of the Principal has any unwholesome influence on his /fellow students, may be suspended or expelled.
- 8. Students must treat school property with respect and any damage to it must be brought to the notice of the school authorities. Students guilty of willful damage will be punished and charged for any necessary repairs/replacements.
- Some forms of bullying and harassment may constitute criminal offences.
- It is the responsibility of every student to inform the school authorities should they see others violating this policy.
- The school will offer appropriate advice on conflict resolution and counselling wherever necessary.
- All students are expected to contribute to a positive learning atmosphere in the class by co-operating with the teacher, getting work done on time, contributing to the discussions, asking relevant, meaningful & inquisitive questions and avoid distractions.
- The school reserves the right to discipline students who breach this Zero Tolerance Policy
 or indeed any student whose behaviour is unsatisfactory. Discipline may include detention,
 suspension or expulsion.

Meetings and Other Obligations

- 1. It is the responsibility of each student to keep himself/herself and his/her parents informed of matters published in the Daily Bulletin and on Notice Boards.
- 2. No collection for any purpose whatsoever is to be started and no meeting, demonstration, party or picnic may be held without the prior written permission of the Principal.
- If a teacher fails to appear for a class, two members of that class should report the matter
 to the Principal's office without delay. The class is expected to sit quietly until a replacement
 teacher arrives.

Dress and Appearance

- Students must dress neatly and wear the official school uniform with pride both at school and in public. Shoes must be clean and ties worn correctly. Belts form an integral part of the Boys' uniform.
- 2. Shirts are to be tucked in at all times
- 3. Jumpers cannot be worn as an outer garment replacement for School blazers.
- 4. The School Dress Code applies to both boarding and day students at all times during the school day.
- 5. Boys' hair must be neat, naturally coloured and cut above the collar and ear levels. Girls' hair is to be naturally coloured and tied back with a black ribbon or 'scrunchy' if it is longer than shoulder length. Makeup is not permitted.
- 6. Ties form an integral part of the uniform and must be worn to and from school, except during the hotter months when students are exempted.
- School sports apparel is worn to and from school on approved occasions for school or House sporting events.
- 8. Appropriate sports-wear must be worn for all sporting activities and games.
- Students should not wear jewellery or display body piercing. If in doubt, students should consult their respective Class Teachers.

Information, Communication & Technological Devices

 Any communication, mobile, audio-visual & computing devices whether analogue or digital are strictly prohibited.

- 2. Emergency calls can be made to the reception, or assistance may be sought from the relevant class teacher or Houseparent, if needed.
- 3. No student is permitted to take selective photographs of another student, or sound record or video another student.
- 4. Mobile and Video games are strictly not permitted at school.
- If students breach these guidelines, they will forego the use of the said gadgets as well as mobile equipment for on a permanent basis. It will NOT be returned to the student or parents and will be donated to an NGO.
- 6. Use of personal computing devices is strictly prohibited. The school allows students to access the electronic networks like internet only for educational purposes. There are strict policies governing its use. Necessary disciplinary action may be taken against any student accessing material that is not allowed. No violations should be made with respect to privacy, confidentiality or intellectual property of the school or any other user.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Students are expected to behave well in Public and to represent their school with pride.
- 2. Students are expected to be alive to the learning process at all times whether in the classroom or outside. Meaningful debates, questions and discussions are encouraged.
- Inappropriate discrimination on ground of gender/race/religion/cultural background/ linguistic background or academic and sporting ability must be avoided at all times.
- 4. Students are expected to behave in a polite and courteous manner. Discipline, good conduct and a cheerful disposition are expected of all students. Appropriate disciplinary action may be taken against students behaving disrespectfully or arguing with staff members.
- 5. Student's access to the staff residences is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Students resorting to dishonest means will be punished.
- 7. Students should clearly mark and identify their personal belongings and be responsible for them. The school advices students not to bring any valuable articles to school. In case of loss of any personal belongings, the school will not be responsible.
- 8. Students are not permitted to carry cash.
- 9. It is against the school policy for any of its staff members, including teachers, to take any gifts, favours and/or accept any personal invitations. Neither parents nor students should approach any staff member of the school for such matters.

SCHOOL RULES

- 10. Birthday clebration: Birthdays are acknowledged in the assembly. Boarding students are permitted to celebrate their birthday with their friends in the evening time. Day boarders may distribute chocolates only to their classmates with prior approval from Principal and the chocolates will be provided from the school.
- 11. The school must be kept litter-free and the responsibility for this is with each student.
- 12. Differently-abled (physically challenged) students and students much younger in age should be given preference in the use of common facilities.
- 13. Students must inform their parents if they are likely to be late returning home.
- 14. All school activities are compulsory unless expressly excused by the school for a valid reason.
- 15. Only parents or authorized local guardian registered in the school records will be permitted to collect their ward from school campus and in case of day boarders, weekly boarders from the drop off point/location.
- 16. The school reserves the right to make changes in the school rules, which will be communicated to students and parents.
- 17. All school rules apply from the time the student rides in the bus to attend school till the time he is dropped off to his/her home.
- 18. Students should report back to school after holidays on the date specified in the calendar.

Taurian Almanac is published annually and provides a means of communication between the parents, teachers and children. Using this Almanac, the children will be able to keep track of the work they need to do, organize and plan their day to ensure improved performance.

Teachers and Parents will be able to interact and monitor the child's progress. Also included in the almanac is a year planner, general instructions and information, and other relevant information.

This almanac is intended to provide information and to ensure effective communication between the school and home. Students are requested to bring this Almanac to school each day If a student loses the almanac, the parents must purchase from the school a replacement after consulting the class teacher.

Scholastic Activities

Taurian World School holds that education is intended for the enrichment of the mind, body & soul. All our academic & non-academic planning and programming are tuned & designed keeping in mind the edifying needs of students whom we grow to remain 'Do kadam aage' in every aspect of their lives.

Our teachers act as facilitators in the classrooms and extend the teaching beyond their four walls and make it more interesting and elucidative to students. The school blends the best of international pedagogies with that of Indian Syllabus & Curriculum. Individual attention is the cornerstone of our academic & infrastructure planning.

Homework

Parents are requested to take interest in the homework and assignments to be submitted by the students regularly as part of their training. Parents should also take the initiative to inspire and challenge their children to take their learning to a new level.

Conceding that at the primary school level, children need to play and interact more in order to grow and enjoy their learning, very limited home assignments are given to students of this age group.

Progressive Learning System

The school follows a system of holistic learning and regularly provides parents with an assessment of their child's academic progress, based on a comprehensive system of tests, examinations, grades & reports to parents in PTMs.



Admission & Attendance

Pupils are usually admitted in the school only at the beginning of the session i.e. in the month of April. A student, who has previously attended a recognized school, cannot be allowed admission in this school without a school leaving certificate from the institution last attended.

Absence

- 1. Students are responsible for making up all work missed by them.
- No students will be allowed to step out of the gate without the gate pass signed by the academic coordinator or class teacher.
- 3. No leave of absence is granted except on medical ground.
- Repeated absence without any prior information or valid reason for more than six
 consecutive days renders the students off the rolls, re-admission may be granted only
 on payment of fresh admission fee.
- Attendance is compulsory on the last working day and the reopening day of each vacation. Absence for more than three days immediately after a vacation renders the student liable to have his/her name struck off the rolls.
- It is compulsory for the students to obtain 75% attendance in the academic year to make them eligible to sit for their final examination. The percentage however can be relaxed on medical grounds, as per CBSE rules and regulations.
- A student returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease should produce a medical certificate permitting him/her to do so.
- It is compulsory or all students to have a dairy note duly signed by parents on joining after leave of absence
- 9. Students to follow the school timings. Anyone reporting late will be sent back home.

Requirement of Attendance for Internal Assessment in the final CBSE Examination

- No Student shall be eligible to take the Senior School Certificate Examination conducted by the CBSE Board unless he/ she has completed 75% of attendance counted from the opening of XI & XII to the first of the month preceding the month in which the examina tion commences in the internal assessment.
- Shortage of up to 15% only may be condoned by the Chairman of the CBSE Board on Medical Grounds, supported by a Medical Certificate from a registered medical officer not below the rank of an Assistant Surgeon, along with the recommendations of the Principal.

Assessment

In an academic year, the school holds two sets of examinations along with the 4 cycle test. The combination of grades and reports serves to assess the progress of the student.



House System

There are Four Houses in the School: Dragon, Griffin, Phoenix, and Unicorn. At the time of admission the student is allotted his/her house.

Each house is headed two students known as House Captains. A member of the staff assisted by several other teachers (tutor) acts as the House warden. Points are awarded to students throughout the year for extracurricular activities, games and sports. At the end of the year, the house gaining the highest number of points is awarded the trophy.

Any student representing a house that he/she doesn't belong to, will be disqualified.

The School has zero tolerance policy for plagiarism. Students found cheating in any assessment/evaluation/examinations will be marked Zero for that assessment. Students absent from an examination will not be re-examined except in the case of a serious, verified medical condition. In case of unexcused absence from examination, students will be excluded from prizes and awards.

Parent Teacher Meetings 'CONNECT'

Periodic Parent Teacher Meetings are held in the school. All parents are requested to remain present & take pro-active part in knowing the progress of their child. Parents can also meet the class teacher with prior appointment to discuss their child's progress. It is the Parent's responsibility to attend regular PTMs and keep herself/himself updated of the child's progress.

Identity Cards

Students are issued with Identity Cards for security purposes as well as access and borrowing rights to the School Library. Cards are issued by Administration. Lost or stolen cards should be reported to the Houseparent, Class teacher, or the Principal as soon as possible. There is a fee charged for replacement cards.

Communication

Parents wishing to meet with the school staff are requested to seek an appointment by email, telephone or through the Almanac Parents are requested to mention in all their communication the name, admission number, class and division of the students.



Parents should acknowledge receipt of each circular issued by the school by signing on the respective section in the Almanac Wherever the circular requires a response from the parent, the same has to be completed and returned by due date.

Parents are requested to read the notes written in the Almanac by the teachers and write their own remarks for the information to the teachers

Parental Responsibilities

- Parents are encouraged to actively participate in class-wise parent-teacher meetings and other functions to show interest in their child's learning. We expect parents to support the discipline of the school and its policies. Parents may speak to the class teacher as the first contact
- 2. Any change of contact details of parents or local guardian must be immediately communicated to the school administration in writing
- 3. Meetings with school's teaching or administrative staff can be held only with prior appointment by telephone/email. Visits during school days without appointment should be avoided except in cases of extreme urgency.
- 4. Parents are requested to respect the fee payment guidelines and remit fees on time as per applicable fee structure.
