


## LEARNING IN THE LAP OF NATURE

Since then, by introducing international corporate best practices into the education sector, Mr. Bajla has nurtured an administrative and management team which manages TWS with clockwork precision while employing globally benchmarked liberal pedagogies and child-friendly education systems.

In a day and age when wide open spaces are hard to come by, Taurian World School nurtures its wards in a beautiful 65 acre, pollution-free, eco-friendly campus away from the chaos of the city. The school's approach to learning is one which focuses not only on academic excellence but also in helping students develop their character, creativity, values, personal leadership and the spirit of enterprise necessary for them to achieve their full potential as global citizens and leaders of the future. "Growing up in the Greens."

In keeping with its philosophy, learning at TWS focuses on growth from within as opposed to growth based on external parameters. There's a huge gap between what is offered in formal education and what life is really all about. The School attempts to bridge that gap. There's a focus on a child's creative skills and developing the mind's powers. Children are taught to look at the whole instead of just one aspect of any situation. The classrooms are designed in such a way to stimulate free thought. The campus has a lot of greenery. Lessons are taught in the project approach method and a topics are dealt with in entirety. Not only does this help the child understand every aspect of the topic, but also trains them to start looking at the big picture.

The School has classes from LKG to Grade XII running in the CBSE stream. The mission of TWS is not just to disseminate knowledge, but to create values and maintain the sacred fire of learning, by inculcating a curiosity for discovery and a thrill for adventure in an atmosphere of mutual trust and caring in the students who come here to seek knowledge. Students who are inducted in to the system at an early age benefit greatly in terms of their personal and academic growth.

It is an established fact that children develop their sense of self very early in life especially through their parents, teachers, and other mentors and by peer interaction. Taurian actually serves as a home away from home. Here individual attention is given to each student. Words of encouragement and appreciation urge the students to perform better.

The school also tries to ensure a collaborative learning culture and climate linked to student learning based on distributed leardership while building up positive and effective interdependencies among peer groups. The aim is to incorporate systemic thinking and strategic planning for school improvement.

Students here are enabled to demonstrate self knowledge and the personal qualities that support positive relationships and build a culture of academic honesty and integrity. Rote learning is discouraged but students learn to conceptualize and research to draw their own inferences at a very early age. They also learn to address issues of diversity and social justice and raise questions that enable reflective enquiry.





### Library:

Taurian World School has a 5600sq. ft integrated library with state of the art architecture which offers 15,000 print volumes and 50 journal subscriptions. Morever, the library constructed entirely of glass structure is bright and spacious. It is equipped with a variety of print and non-print materials, computer hardward and software and other resources which fully support the school's curriculum.

### Security:

Safety in schools plays an important role in the academic success of each child, giving them the confidence to learn and achieve in a safe and nurturing environment. The strict policies in the school for safety help in more learning and decrease the level of violence and increases the pro-social behavior.

The infrastructure of Taurian World School is designed to handle all aspects of co-education learning and boarding environment. In India, safety is of prime concern for parents especially if they are thinking of sending their girl child to a residential school. At TWS, special care has been undertaken to ensure that our students are accommodated protectively and are comfortable in all respects during their stay in school. TWS has a reliable security system with professional security personnel, a completely fenced with 8 feet tall concrete wall with razor sharp barbed wire, 24/7 guard duty, watchdog are in place to safeguard the sprawling campus. The security guards are deployed in key areas under the supervision of chief security officer.

Keeping all the man-made and natural disasters happening in mind, TWS has the security enforced by manning all vulnerable areas and points such as the dormitory, in or out gates, electrical installations and vehicle parking areas and a female staff stationed at the girl's hostel too. Area and perimeter patrolling by security guards during after-hours ensure the security of the area. Our campus is equipped with 240 CCTVs across the campus. Aayas for small children, Lady Attendant in each bus and outside each bathroom are also allotted for maximum protection.

### Transport

The safety and comfort of our students and staff traveling from the city to school and back are of paramount importance too. TWS has a fleet of air-conditioned school buses that adhere to the highest safety standards. Manned by well trained drivers and attendants, our transport service operates throughout the city of Ranchi and Khunti. We are in the process of installing a GPS tracking and SMS system in all our buses to raise the security level.

### Medical Facilities in TWS

For us, the health of our students is of primary concern. We have an excellent medical centre on campus with medical professionals available round the clock. Quaterly health checkups are held class-wise for all the students.

TWS has a 25 bedded in-house hospital within the campus with three qualified resident medical professionals and necessary supporting staff. The clinic has an isolation unit, stretcher, wheel chairs and oxygen cylinders. Minor ailments are attended to immediately and in case of emergency, we are having a tie-up with the best multi-specialty hospital in Ranchi, The Orchid Hospital. TWS also has fully air-conditioned Ambulance for emergencies 24/7.

At the time of admission, we acquire each student's medical records (including information on any allergies) so that it will be referred whenever he / she comes to the medical centre. Emergency first-aid is provided in case of any accident and the child is rushed to a hospital if the situation so worsens. We not only take care of the student's health but also advise them on hygiene and preventive care that may be needed during the years of rapid physical growth.

### Laundry

To ensure that boarding students lead a hassle-free life in a clean environment, the school has its own Industrial Laundry divided into washing and ironing sections.









Boarding life is busy, exciting and brimming with opportunities to experience new activities and develop new friendships. It is important for boarders to eat well, get plenty of sleep and plan some quiet time each week to ensure they are well-organised for school and co-curricular commitments. Our boarding staff are experienced in assisting students of all ages to plan their routines and make adaptations when required.

### **Dining Experiences**

Morning and evening meals generally are enjoyed in the Dining Room where the students catch up with staff after a busy day. Our chefs and services team play an important role in ensuring the kids have plenty of fresh food daily.

### Did you wonder where do these foods come from?

Garden fresh pure organic vegetables are grown organically in-house at Taurian World School. That means our vegetables are grown only with the help of natural manure and compost and no chemicals are used. We strive to cycle resources, promote ecological balance, and conserve biodiversity. We restrict the use of certain pesticides and fertilizers in farming so that we can serve fresh and healthy green vegetables to the students thus making them consume healthy. It is said that healthy food leads to a healthy body and mind. Organic foods often have more beneficial nutrients, such as antioxidants, than their conventionally-grown counterparts and people with allergies to foods, chemicals, or preservatives often find their symptoms lessen or go away when they eat only organic foods.

Some Features of our Organic Farm:

- Drip-Irrigation system of Galcon. It is a bypass type Fertijet machine; Fertijet is designed to inject nutrients into the irrigation water pipe with high accuracy, by a set of venturi type fertilizer injectors, along with EC & pH control.
- Students of our school do organic farming by themselves.
- Students also get involved in the nursery in polyhouse, sowing seeds, irrigation and use organic manures for plants.
- The students themselves prepare Jeevamrut which is considered to be an excellent source of natural carbon; biomass, Nitrogen, Phosphorous, Potassium and lot of other micro nutrients required for the crops.

In our Farm we produce various vegetables such as Carrot, Papaya, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Green Pea and Capsicum which are rich sources of nutrients.

Similarly we produce many organic and fresh healthy nutritious vegetables in our farm. Some more vegetables like Potato, Reddish, Coriander Leaf, Spinach, Green Chilly, Sponge gourd, Bitter gourd, Lady Finger and Tomato are also produced. These vegetables when cooked have a deliciously taste and students love to eat them.

We also Produce Green fodder for our Cows & Horse. Green fodder plays major role in feed of animals. Any feed that is made from green crop like legume crop, grass crops, cereals crops or tree based crops is called green fodder. Green fodder cultivation cut the cost of feed. Fodders are made into silage and we used them in long time. This gives much nutrition to animals. Apart from this we also grow Napier Grass, Babycorn, Genera, Barshim, Oats, Green Gram, Green Pea Leaf, and Azolla.







### DAIRY FARM

At Taurian we have our own Dairy Farm where we have 55 healthy cows. An inhouse Veterinary Doctor takes care of them. He prescribes proper diet for the cows so that the milk obtained is nutritious. He checks proper cleaning and whether the feed given to each cow is in proper way and in balanced quantity. The feed given to cows are green fodder which is grown in our very own Organic farm. Green fodder plays major role in animal's diet. It gives much nutrition to animals which in turn give healthy and nourishing milk. We also feed them with Maize, Napier Grass, Baby corn, Genera, Barshim, Green Gram, Green Pea Leaf, and Azolla from the TWS Organic Farm. Apart from this, we also forage them with boiled food like Maize Durra. Soya bean Cake, Groundnut Cake, Mustard Cake, Tissi khalli, Hay, Husk of Wheat. There is separate care taken for lactating cows as well as their calves.

Organic Milk produced from natural cows plays a significant part in a child's growth. It strengthens and protects the body and mind to live a fuller, more complete life each day.

It is a well known fact that milk is a good source of vitamin D and calcium. Fresh and pure Dairy cow milk is also perfect to balance a child's meal or their snack. The nutritional facts in the cow milk entirely depend on the cow milk you are choosing. This is one of the reasons as to why medical experts always stress on the need to choose cow milk from the suppliers who feed and take good care of the cows. This ensures that the milk given by such cows is full of essential nutrients, calories, minerals and vitamins. This is exactly what we want our kids to drink since it is not only fresh and pure but is filled with all the essential nutrients.

From the Organic Milk, we also produce Dairy foods like cheese, yogurt, buttermilk, cream, ghee, khoya and much more dairy products.

Our Cows are grass fed and have good content of omega-3 fats which is a good form of cholesterol for the body which helps in improving the heart health and also prevents any cardiovascular conditions.




"Life skills" are psychosocial abilities for adaptive and positive behaviour that enable individuals to deal effectively with the demands and challenges of everyday life.

### Caged - An Adventure of A Different Kind

As I pondered over the topic 'caged', casually flipping through the pages of a poetry book, little did I know that I would enter into an adventure of an interesting discovery. Maya Angelou's poem, 'I Know Why The Caged Bird sings' caught my attention and the lines,

"But the bird that stalks / Down his narrow cage Can seldom see through / His bars of rage His wings are clipped / His feet are tied So he opens his throat to sing."

struck me and acted like a shot in my arms. I was confronted by a confusion of thoughts and I knew I needed to iron them out to arrive at a clear stream of reason. Iron bars always ignite outrage, frustrations, loss of freedom and a demoralization that can damage individuals, sometimes, permanently. Yet I glimpsed a light shining at the end of this tunnel. There have been umpteen number of cases where, 'wings are clipped...' and 'feets are tied...' yet there are many with '...open throats to sing...'. These are caged souls who find an ability to encourage and become inspirational guides for future generations to carry on the belief that there is yet goodness in man. Telling that, all is not lost, even when cage bars and locks, impede ones movement the mind and soul of man they cannot fetter.

I did not know till now that some of the greatest masterpieces had been penned in jails and cells. Whether the writers were prisoners of war, political strife or victims of bigotry, it was the solitude and lack of distractions that helped them to produce great literature. The genius in man gives him the ability to shine even when caged.

Who would have guessed that fairy tales too had Rapunzel use her ingenuity to escape the wrath of a witch, all for the sake of love? Rapunzel in her high caged tower, used her long plaits to summon her beloved, and ease her boredom and monotony. Her cage did not stop her from using her imagination and creative thinking.

Miguel de Cervantes the creator of the humorous satire, 'Don Quixote' wrote a part of his magnum opus while in jail, serving time for his debt troubles in seventeenth century Spain. In fact one could conclude, that had he not been caged, we may not have had today's pop-culture, idealistic chivalrous protagonist archetype. Didn't the cage serve him well?



Remember Marco Polo, the European traveler to the East! Returning to Venice after 24 years

of living in the east, he found Venice at war with Genoa and when his Venetian fleet was captured, Polo was taken prisoner and incarcerated in jail. There he recounted episodes of his travels to fellow inmate, Rustichello de Pisa, who compiled his tales into what we know as 'The Travels of Marco PoLo' This book became popular as an eye – opener to the Western world to catch exciting glimpses of the exotic East.

Who isn't familiar with O'Henry's Christmas classic 'The Gift of the Magi'? William Sidney Porter, was his christened name and he used the solitude of his caged cell, where he was imprisoned for embezzlement, to pen his famed story, for the world to ponder over. Speaking in the same breathe, I cannot forget to mention another great, Oscar Wilde. Best known for his witty and flippant writings, he wrote his well known work 'De Profundis' when imprisoned for 2 years of hard labour for indecent behavior. The book was published posthumously, and is a treatise on redemption and spiritual fulfillment.

Nearer home and closer to our times was our Nobel Laureate, Nelson Mandela, who was imprisoned and caged in 1962, for 27 years, 19 years of which were spent on Robben Island. This incarceration helped him to lay bare his soul, and reveal to the public, yearnings for, a freedom denied. Had he not been caged, would he have been able to recognize

those hidden desires? His diary entries, during this period are extraordinary recordings of significant events happening in his life while imprisoned. His fight against Apartheid found voice in his letters, diary entries and writings, telling the world, that it is men of such mettle who become torch bearers, in a chaotic world that needs direction.

Bear with me as I remind you of one more instance, of a caged bird who opened his throat to sing. Jawaharlal Nehru, the first prime minister of free India. When imprisoned during the freedom movement, he used this cage, as an opportunity to write 'Letters to His Daughter' telling her and the world a brief history of a culturally rich Indian heritage. Today this book is used as a text read by thousands of school children in schools

I could go on and on talking of so many such caged souls who opened their throats to sing and because they sang, the world is richer in human interest stories that entertain and inspire. They teach us, if we want to learn, ways to live improved lives.

I cannot deny, that being caged or life inside man-made bars has heaped untold cruelties on victims, who have been tortured and killed. Those caged unfortunates have suffered bestiality of humankind seen at its worst. Being caged has rendered victims to be sacrificed at the altar of depravity. I cannot but be reminded of Dachau, Auschwitz, Bergen-Belson, Sobibor etc. that inflicts soul piercing anguish.

Yet, in all its ugliness, I prefer to look for positive angles in this ugly world of cages. Let me tell you I'm not an escapist, but one who still has hopes for goodness to reign supreme one day. If this is not a farfetched vision, do I see a phoenix –like phenomena happening in the cages of the world? Can the ordinary

human being living a day to day existence in an ordinary world, transform into a creature rising above the mundane, into a soul that can touch the zenith of excellence behind caged locks?

### Maintain Oral Hygiene

Taking good care of your mouth and teeth throughout your life can help prevent problems as you get older. Taking care of your teeth means brushing and flossing every day and seeing the dentist regularly.

A healthy mouth is more important than you might think. Consider everything you expect your mouth to do each day. You use your mouth to eat, to smile, to speak, and more. Poor oral health can affect any or all of these things.

Good oral health isn't hard to achieve but it does take discipline. Use these tips for a lifetime of taking care of your mouth and teeth.

### Infants and children

The first set of teeth is already almost completely formed at birth. At first, these teeth are "hiding" under the gums. These teeth are important, because after they come in, they let your baby chew food and talk well. You baby's first set of teeth also holds the space where permanent teeth will eventually be. They help permanent teeth grow in straight.

### **Teens**

Taking good care of your mouth and teeth will help you have pleasant breath, a nice smile, and fewer cavities. Here are some simple things you can do:

- Brush your teeth at least twice a day with a fluoride toothpaste.
- Floss your teeth at least once a day.
- Don't smoke or chew tobacco, which can stain your teeth, give you bad breath, and cause cancer.
- Wear the right protective headgear while playing contact sports.

See your dentist every 6 months for regular check-ups and cleanings.

### Adults

Continuing good mouth and tooth care as an adult can help you avoid tooth loss, painful gums, or other problems. If you have any problems with your teeth or concerns about your mouth, see your doctor or dentist right away.




### **Proper Brushing Technique**

Tilt the brush at a 45° angle against the gumline and sweep or roll the brush away from the gumline.

Gently brush the outside, inside and chewing surface of each tooth using short back-and-forth strokes. Gently brush your tongue to remove bacteria and freshen breath.

### Which type of toothbrush should I use?

Your dentist will be able to recommend a toothbrush suitable for you. However, adults should choose a small- to medium-sized brush head. This should have soft to medium, multi-tufted, round-ended nylon bristles or 'filaments'. The head should be small enough to reach into all parts of the mouth: especially the back of the mouth where it can be difficult to reach. Children need to use smaller brushes but with the same type of filaments.

You can now buy more specialised toothbrushes. For instance, people with sensitive teeth can now use softer-bristled brushes. There are also smaller-headed toothbrushes for people with crooked or irregular teeth. Some people find it difficult to hold a toothbrush, for example because they have Parkinson's disease or a physical disability. There are now toothbrushes which have large handles and angled heads to make them easier to use.

### How do electric toothbrushes work?

A power brush has an oscillating rotating or vibrating head, which provides a large amount of cleaning action with very little movement needed from the user, although you do need to position the brush correctly.

### Why is brushing important?

Daily brushing and cleaning between your teeth is important because it removes plaque. If the plaque isn't removed, it continues to build up, feeding on the bits of food left behind and causes tooth decay and gum disease.

### How often should I change my toothbrush?

Worn-out toothbrushes cannot clean your teeth properly and may damage your gums. It is important to change your toothbrush every two to three months, or sooner if the filaments become worn. When bristles become splayed, they do not clean properly.

### Final words

Good dental health begins with you. By following these simple tips you can keep your mouth clean and healthy:

- Brush your teeth for two minutes, last thing at night and at least one other time during the day, using fluoride toothpaste.
- Spit toothpaste out after brushing and do not rinse.
- Use a toothbrush with a small- to medium-sized head.
- Use a toothbrush with soft to medium, multi-tufted, round-ended nylon bristles.
- Consider using a power toothbrush.
- Use small, circular movements to clean your teeth.
- Change your toothbrush regularly, and at least every 3 months.
- Clean between your teeth every day using interdental brushes or dental floss.
- Have sugary drinks and foods less often.
- w Visit your dental team regularly, as often as they recommend.



## TAURIAN CRICKET ACADEMY



It is a process by which Taurian World School attempts to respond to all pupils as individuals by reconsidering and restricting its curricular organisation and provision and allocating resources to enhance equality of opportunity. Through this process TWS builds its capacity to accept all pupils from the local community who wish to attend and, in doing so, reduces the need to exclude pupils.

Under TPLC we have three full time Special Education Teachers specialized in various fields including Sensory Motor Integration, Behavioural and Cognitive Therapy, Basic Speech Therapy techniques and Early Developmental Therapy to name a few.

### WORKSHOP ON INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

A Professional Development Workshop on 'Inclusive Education & Adolescence' was conducted for All the Academic Staff including the Hostel Wardens, Medical Department, Library, Sports, Music, Arts & Dance Department, Security, Transport and F&B Department on 6th & 7th June 2018 in the School's Assembly Hall. The resource person who conducted the sessions was Ms. Salony Priya, Director, UMMEED Counselling & Consulting Services.

#### 6th June 2018

The first day was about creating a child centric learning behavior environment which depends on 3 major factors i.e. Relationship with Self (emotional well being), Relationship with People (social well being) and Relationship with Curriculum (cognitive well being). Other factors which play a supporting role are family, culture, community, school policy, educational services and school ethos. Rita Pearson's video on how to create a positive environment in the classroom was an eye opener for all. It also raised a pertinent question as how best can a academician prepare the students for a future which is so rapidly changing and is unknown to them as well. In such cases it becomes extremely important for the educator to impart the life skills which will be the greatest assets for the students to face the challenges that this ever changing world will present to them.

Ms. Salony also discussed about the Child Rights and ensuring physical and emotional safety of the students at school. She also highlighted that the general perception and understanding about this right is limited to RTE- and that too that teachers have to pass the students even though they are not doing well. She shared that RTE has been formulated to ensure that children's rights are safeguarded as they are the most vulnerable. Therefore, it is extremely important to understand the Rights of children and give them what they deserve. She then brought to everyone's notice that there are many NGOs and helplines available to render any kind of help to children. She also shared different protective rules like – POCSO which are in place to ensure appropriate actions.



She also conducted an activity based on different classroom situations. The teachers worked in groups and presented an action plan for the situations given to them. The situations given were very real in nature and general phenomena in the classroom. This helped them identify different action plans to respond. She also highlighted that it's necessary that a teacher understands the issue and RESPONDS to such situations in an amicable way.

### **Contribution of Indian Mathematicians**

### **ARYABHATA (476—550 AD)**

- (1) Aryabhatta was born in 476 A.D. Kusumpur, India. He was the first in the line of great mathematicians from the classical age of Indian Mathematics and Astronomy.
- (2) His famous work are the "Aryabhatiya" and the "Aryasiddhanta". The Mathematical part of the Aryabhatiya covers arithmetic. algebra, plane and spherical trigonometry. The Aryasiddhanta, a lot work on astronomical computation.
- (3) Approximation of Pi : Aryabhata work on the approximation for pi (π) and may have come to the conclusion that π is an irrational number. In the 2nd part of Aryabhatiya, he writes the ratio of circumference to diameter is 3.1416.
- (4) Aryabhata gave the formula for area of a triangle. He also discussed the concept of sine in his work by the name of ardhajya. If we use Aryabhata's table & calculate the value of sin





- 300 which is 1719/3438=0.5., the value is correct. His alphabetic code is commonly known as the Aryabhata cipher.
- (5) He was first person to say that the Earth is a sphere and it revolves around the sun.
- (6) He gave the formula  $(a+b)^2 = a^2 + b^2 + 2ab$ .
- [7] He taught the method of solving the following problems: 1+2+3+....+n = n(n+1)/2, 12+22+32+...+n2 = n(n+1)(2n+1)/6 n(n+1)/2

### **BRAHMAGUPT (598–668 AD)**


Brahmagupta was an Indian mathematician and astronomer who wrote two important works on mathematics : the

Brahmasphutasiddhanta and the Khandakhadyaka and he was the first mathematician to use the concept of the zero. But right now people don't know where Brahmagupta's mathematics was derivated from.





- 2) He was the first to use zero as a number. He gave rules to compute with zero.
- (3) He gave four methods of multiplication.
- (4) He gave following formulae, used in G.P. series a+ar+ar2+ar3 +......
  ....+arn-1 =a(rn -1)/(r-1)
- (5) He gave the following formulae(Brahmagupta's formula): Area of a cyclic quadilateral, where 2s= a+b+c+d. Length of its diagonals= (ac+bd), (ac+bd).



### BHASKARACHARYA (1114-1185 AD)

- (1) He was born in Bijapur in modern Karnataka. He & his work represent a significant contribution mathematical astronomical knowledge in the 12th century.
- work "Siddhanta His main Shiromani" is divided into four parts called Lilawati, Bijaganit, Grahaganita and Goladhyaya. These four sections deal with arithmetic. algebra. mathematics of planets and spheres respectively.



- (3) He was the first to claim that any number divided by zero gives infinity.
- (4) He has written a lot about zero, surds, permutation and combination.
- (5) He wrote," The hundredth part of the circumference of a circle seems to be straight. Our earth is a big sphere and that's why it appears to be flat."
- He gave the formulae like:  $sin(A\pm B) = sinA cosB \pm cosA sinB$ .
- He calculated derivatives of Trigonometric functions and formulae.
- He developed spherical trigonometry along with a number of other trigonometric results.
- (9) He explained solution of quadratic, cubic and quartic indeterminate equations.
- 10) He developed a proof of Pythagoras Theorem by calculating the same area in two different ways & these cancel out terms to get a2 + b2 = c2.
- 11) He gave first general method for finding the solution of the problem

- x2 ny2 = 1 (so called Pell's equation ).
- [12] He gave solution of Diophantine equations of second order such as 61x2 + 1

### **RAMANUJAN (1887-1920)**

(1) Ramanujan was born on 22nd of December 1887 in Erode, Madras Presidency. made extraordinary contributions to mathematical analysis, number infinite theory. series. and continued fractions.



- He demonstrated unusual mathematical skill at school, winning accolades and awards.
- By 17, he had conducted his own mathematical research on (3) Bernoulli numbers and the Fuler-Mascheroni constant
- He discovered theorems of his own and rediscovered Euler's identity independently.
- He sent a set of 120 theorems to Professor Hardy of Cambridge. As a result he invited Ramanujan to England.
- He independently compiled nearly 3900 results (mostly identities and equations). Nearly all his claims have now been proved correct.
- Ramanujan showed that any big number can be written as sum of not more than four prime numbers.
- [8] He showed that how to divide the number into two or more squares or cubes.
- Ramanujan's Number: When Mr. G.H. Hardy came to see Ramanujan in taxi number 1729 Ramanujan said that 1729 is the smallest number which can be written in the form of sum of cubes

- of two numbers in two ways, i.e. 1729=93+103=13+123 since than the number 1729 is called Ramanujan's number.
- (10) In 1918, Ramanujan and Hardy studied the partition function P(n) extensively and gave a non-convergent asymptotic series that permits exact computation of the number of partition of an integer.
- (11) He discovered mock thata function in the last year of his life .For many years these functions were a mystry, but they are now known to be the holomorphic parts of harmonic weak mass forms.

### **SHAKUNTALA DEVI**

- (1) She was born in 1939. She is an Indian calculating prodiay.
- By the age of 6, she demonstrated her calculation and memorization abilities at the university of Mysore. At the age of 8, she had



On June 18, 1980, she demonstrated the multiplication of two 13-digit numbers 7,686,369,774,870X2,465,099.745,779 picked at random by the Computer Department of Imperial College, London. She answered the question in 28 seconds. However, the time is more likely the time for dictating the answer (a 26-digit number) than the time for mental calculation the time of 28 seconds was websitel quoted her Her answer 18.947.668.177.995.426.773.730. This event is mentioned on page 26 of the 1995 Gunness Book of Records.

- In Dallas, she competed with a computer to see who give the cube of 188138517 faster, she won.
